

A family qualifies for services if they meet the following criteria:

- Live in Jefferson, Walker or St. Clair County
- Have an income below the federal poverty level
- Are pregnant or have a child under the age of three years.



When we have a waiting list, priority is given to:

- Children who are homeless
- Children in foster care
- Children with disabilities (at risk or diagnosed)
- Children at risk for child abuse and neglect
- Dual Language Learners
- Families challenged by substance abuse
- Teen moms
