



UAB HEALTH SERVICES RESEARCH TRAINING PROGRAM

Seeks Postdoctoral Trainee

This full-time mentored research training program supports trainees in health services and outcomes research and is led by Program Directors Mike Mugavero, MD, MHSc, and Emily Levitan, ScD. Support begins July 1, 2026 and is for a maximum of two years, contingent on satisfactory progress.

Training Program includes:

- Protected, full-time mentored research experience
- Weekly Friday Fellows seminars (Fall & Spring semesters)
- Monthly career development workshops
- Twice annual Works-in-Progress presentations and check-ins
- Office hours with COERE members who hold primary offices or hotel weekly on Boshell 8
- National presentation and publication expectations

Benefits include:

- Stipend at federal PGY level and health insurance
- Full tuition coverage for masters and certificate programs
- Support to be used at postdoc's discretion on training related expenses such as travel and supplemental professional development activities
- Immersive training experience with COERE on Boshell 8 via shared postdoc office with 6 workstations (see photos below)
- Membership in a successful, vibrant, and distinct program alumni community

Eligibility

- Eligible applicants will have earned a clinical or research doctorate, including PhD, ScD, DrPH, MD, DO, DC, ND, DDS, DMD, DNS or equivalent doctoral degree.
- For clinicians, the program may be coordinated with a current residency program or clinical fellowship and will allow for some minimum time allocated to clinical activities that are conducted outside the 40 hours per week required for full-time research training.
- No citizenship or permanent residency requirements.
- Applicants who do not currently have a UAB appointment are encouraged to apply.
- Because this position is funded by HSOM, the primary mentor of applicants must have a full-time primary appointment in HSOM.
