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WHAT DOES THE CBPR PROGRAM CONSIST OF?

The 4-day* Intensive training will teach you all the principles of CBPR. It includes:

- **Didactic lessons** that highlight the principles of CBPR.
- **Small group work facilitated by a CBPR expert.** In these small groups you will work together to implement principles explained in the didactic. In these groups you will hear of the work others want to conduct, and often find others you may want to collaborate with.
- **You will hear from different groups** of people who conduct CBPR studies or build programs and learn of their challenges and how they overcame these challenges.
- **You will meet community members** who have partnered with researchers and hear why they participate in CBPR-based studies, what they and their communities get from it, and how they view their partnership with the CBPR researchers.

In the mentoring program:

- **How to implement the CBPR principles with *your* group of interest:** In group mentoring with a CBPR expert and others who have completed the training, you will work on how to implement the CBPR principles in your study with your group of interest.
- **If you are applying for a CBPR-focused grant:** In-group mentoring (and in some cases, 1:1 mentoring) with a CBPR expert and others who have completed the training and applying for a grant.

*If your population of focus is older adults, you may be eligible to apply for a scholarship.
